
# A Sense of Place -The Buick Memorial Primary School Past and Present

Nestling in the Maine Valley between Galgorm Woods and the Beech Plantation and bluebells of Historic Hillmount, our school takes advantage of the outdoor learning opportunities provided by our beautiful rural setting in the middle of County Antrim. History surrounds us from the naming of our village, Cullybackey, 'the angle in the wood' to the charms of Arthur Cottage and the Millennium River Walk.

Generations of children have come through our doors and the building has a unique atmosphere as an integral part of Cullybackey community and village. A recent documentary by the BBC entitled , 'A Carryin' Stream' highlighted the history and influence of our local school and the high esteem in which Buick is held.

Cullybackey National School was founded in 1819 but the first Public Elementary School was built on the present site in 1900. The new school was named after Dr GR Buick, the minister of Cuningham Memorial Presbyterian Church as he had been the principal donor for the construction of the

building. In 1937 the school was remodelled and enlarged. Two further extensions were made in the 1960s and 1970s and our Nursery

Unit was opened in 2003.

- nurturing of personal and social skills and the development of healthy values and attitudes in order to make a positive contribution to our community and wider society



# **Celebrating Success**

Children's curricular and extra-curricular achievements are celebrated at Citizenship Assemblies each week. Music exam certificates, sporting wins, team events or individual successes are feted in school. Whole school initiatives such as Sustrans awards and Eco endeavours are part of a wider culture of encouragement and individual and community achievement. Children become increasingly confident as they are afforded opportunities to perform on stage and in the public arena, both in school and at community events.



#### **Academic Success**

In 2019 90% of children who chose to enter the AQE Transfer examination secured places at local Grammar Schools:

Ballymena Academy, Cambridge House Grammar, Dalriada Grammar School and Slemish College.

# **Support Every Step of the Way**

### Learning Support and Special Needs Education

Buick Memorial has a dedicated Special Needs teacher. When children are identified as having a special educational need, the teacher and Special Needs Co-ordinator provide a personal learning plan to support the child. Progress is monitored throughout the year and internal and external programmes of support are implemented as appropriate. Buick Memorial aims to provide access to the curriculum for all children in the school. A smooth continuum of learning is promoted to ensure the needs of each child is met through their learning journey. There is a strong emphasis on pastoral care and the health and well-being of all children.



# Safeguarding and Child Protection Provision

Buick Memorial successfully completed ETI inspection on Safeguarding and Child Protection in June 2018.

#### E-safety

In Buick Memorial each year group completes a dedicated programme of age appropriate lessons on e-safety. The teaching of e-safety is reviewed regularly owing to the fast pace of change in technology and social media.

#### **Nursery and Primary One Induction:**

The school operates a programme of induction for Nursery and Primary One pupils. An Induction pack is made available to parents on Induction Day in June. Further details may be found on the school website.

#### **Primary Seven Transition:**

Primary Seven pupils are prepared for the transition to secondary level education through a programme of confidence building and familiarisation events through the PDMU curriculum and the use of workshops and outside agencies.

### Admission

During the admissions procedure when applying the criteria punctual applications will be considered before late applications are considered. The application procedure opens on 7th January 2020 at 12 noon (GMT) and an application submitted by the closing date of 30th January 2020 at 12 noon (GMT) will be treated as a punctual application. An application received after 12 noon (GMT) on 30th January will be treated as a late application.

Admissions criteria to be used in the event of the school being over-subscribed. The criteria are listed in order of priority.

Only children of compulsory school age will be considered for admission. Preference will be given to:

- 1. Children who have a brother or sister already attending the school
- 2. Children who have attended Buick Memorial Primary School's Nursery Unit
- 3. Children who have attended Happitots Pre-School Centre, Cullybackey.

In the event of the school still being over-subscribed following the application of the above criteria, final decisions will be made on the basis of the distance from home to school as measured by the shortest walking distance.

### Attendance

Children are expected to attend school for 190 school days each year. Attendance is recorded electronically, morning and afternoon. For more details, see the Attendance Policy on our School Website.
