That's the first month of this academic session completed and everybody is back in full swing. Homework completion has seen a marked improvement, and we want to sustain this level of effort until June!


#### Assembly

#### **Child Protection**

\* This weekly section is a legal requirement for your reference in an emergency situation. \*

If you have any concerns about your child's safety in school, you can speak to Mr Beattie, (Designated Teacher for Child Protection), or to Mrs Shirlow, (Deputy Designated Teacher). If you are still concerned, you may contact the Principal, Miss R Peters, who oversees the Safeguarding Team within Buick Memorial Primary School. Additionally, you may contact the Board of Governors. Our Child Protection Governor is Rev. Philip Moffett.

If you have any concerns about a child or community activity out of school hours, you can talk to a Social Worker at the Social Services Gateway Team on 0300 1234 333 or PSNI on 101.

Like all primary schools, Buick links with PSNI Officers to engage in Operation Encompass. This is a legal requirement which ensures appropriate information is shared accordingly.

As professionals, we have a legal duty of care for children. As part of this, 'Notes of Concern' are completed inhouse if staff have any worries regarding a child's presentation. This presentation includes their attendance, personal hygiene, nutritional provision, growth and development, uncharacteristic behaviours and comments/worries they share about home life. If appropriate, these records may be shared with Social Services.

## Dining Centre and Lunches

Next week, commencing Monday 6<sup>th</sup> October, sees the introduction of a new seasonal menu. Please ensure you check this menu to inform your child correctly.

School dinners remain at a cost of £2.60 per day for P1-P7. Nursery children can avail of school dinners which will cost £2.50 per day, with only one food option available from the EA.

Nutrition is essential for growth and brain development, so please carefully consider the content of your child's packed lunch and please provide a healthy snack for break time. Our Dining Centre provision complies with all Education Authority Guidelines.

## Transfer Interviews

Thank you to all P7 parents/carers who participated in their Parent Interview with their child's Class Teacher. It is always beneficial for those children sitting the SEAG Transfer Assessment to have these conversations early on in Term 1. Only 6 weeks until Paper 1!

Parent Interview times for Nursery - P6 and the remaining P7 pupils will be released via ParentMail on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> October at 7pm. As in previous years, these interviews will be conducted by telephone. We look forward to speaking with parents/carers to share details of your child's educational development and to discuss ways in which you can support your child's progress at home.

As a school, we recognise that we need effective partnership working to meet the needs of all children. Please ensure you are ready to receive the telephone call at your chosen time and converse succinctly within your time allocation. This readiness and diligence will ensure the afternoons run smoothly for all stakeholders.
