We have received a few complaints from members of the public about Buick parents parking on the zig zag lines outside the front gates. This has caused congestion on Main Street at peak collection times. Parents and carers are gently reminded to adhere to all highway code legislation and to ensure children are safe entering and leaving their school.

Child Protection

* This weekly section is a legal requirement for your reference in an emergency situation. *

If you have any concerns about your child's safety in school, you can speak to Mr Beattie, (Designated Teacher for Child Protection), or to Mrs Shirlow, (Deputy Designated Teacher). If you are still concerned, you may contact the Principal, Miss R Peters, who oversees the Safeguarding Team within Buick Memorial Primary School. Additionally, you may contact the Board of Governors. Our Child Protection Governor is Rev. Philip Moffett.

If you have any concerns about a child or community activity out of school hours, you can talk to a Social Worker at the Social Services Gateway Team on 0300 1234 333 or PSNI on 101. Like all primary schools, Buick links with PSNI Officers to engage in Operation Encompass. This is a legal requirement which ensures appropriate information is shared accordingly.

As professionals, we have a legal duty of care for children. As part of this, 'Notes of Concern' are completed inhouse if staff have any worries regarding a child's presentation. This presentation includes their attendance, personal hygiene, nutritional provision, growth and development, uncharacteristic behaviours and comments/worries they share about home life. If appropriate, these records may be shared with Social Services.

Dining Centre and Budget

Monday 10^{th} November sees the continuation of our new seasonal menu. Please ensure you check this menu to inform your child correctly.

School dinners remain at a cost of £2.60 per day for P1-P7. Nursery children can avail of school dinners which will cost £2.50 per day, with only one food option available from the EA. You may have seen on the news this week, that the Education Authority will be increasing primary school meals to £3.10 per day and Nursery meals to £3 per day from January 2026. We recognise this is a significant increase but unfortunately, we have no control over this price rise. Children who avail of Free School Meals will continue to do so.

Furthermore, in relation to school budgets. Every school has been instructed to carefully consider their allocated budget and spending in moving forward. Currently, we have structured our classes in accordance with our school budget and to meet the diverse needs of our children. In moving forward, it is likely that changes will need to be made for the 2026/27 academic session. The Board of Governors will carefully consider all feasible options and keep you informed accordingly on developments. Your support is greatly appreciated as these difficult decisions are made.

NSPCC

This week, Miss Peters spoke to KS1 and then KS2 about the NSPCC's Speak Out Stay Safe Programme. The short clip, hosted by Ant and Dec, was pitched at the correct level for our children.

We have a duty of care to educate children on staying safe and we believe that our children received the message well, displaying a good level of understanding regarding acceptable and unacceptable behaviours. NSPCC personnel will be visiting Buick next Tuesday to conduct Workshops in P3HM, P3S, P6QC, P7B and P7M. These workshops are wonderful opportunities for children to learn more about managing any worries/concerns or fears which they may have.

Parents who have opted out from the workshop and questionnaire have already notified the school via ParentMail. These specific children will be placed in alternative classes whilst these workshops take place.
